

## Food Chains

Read 'Good Golden Sun' and use this as a stimulus to explore how sunlight is key to powering life on Earth. Explore food chains and research how different animals obtain their food. Children could create their own food chain diagrams showing the flow of energy from the sun to the final animal.




## Shadow Play

The narrative in the book traces the mysteries of light from sunup to sundown. Along the way, the reader meets different animals in sunlight and shadow. Children could use building blocks to make shapes and draw around them. Consider how the shadow changes at different times of the day as the sun moves.



## Sunlight Images

Ask children to create their own sunlight images using the colour palette from the book. Can they capture the feeling of the sun and its warmth?

## Get Creative

Author and illustrator Brendan Wenzel is known for using a mix of water colours and cut paper to create his illustrations. Look through the images in the books and see if you can recreate your own using similar techniques.



## Descriptive Writing

Descriptive writing often uses the senses to paint a picture for the reader. Choose an image from the book and write a description of the scene using your senses to help structure your writing. You could use the sentence stems below to help:

I can see...  
I can smell..  
I can hear...  
I can touch...  
I can taste...



## Asking Questions

Throughout the book, questions are asked by different creatures to the sun e.g. Do you ever get cold? How did you get so big? Are you happy? Are you sad?

Ask the children to write their own questions to the sun. They could even swap with a partner and answer in role as the sun itself!
