
Lesson ideas for Teachers

Ages 5-8



Lower Primary

<u>Skeletons</u>

"Like Dad's wooden skeletons . . . That song he sings . . . The thigh bone's connected to the hip bone. The hip bone's connected to the backbone. The backbone's connected to the neck bone . . . " p.106

- Students name the animals drawn as skeletons seen on pages 14 and 15.
- Students listen to the song, "'Dem bones" and sing and dance along. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=PbI4BNkAq_U
- Students then talk about the different bones we have in our bodies, (how many do we have? (206) and create a craft using cotton wool buds like the one below.

Upper Primary

The Solar System

"What's an observatory?" asked Ivy. "A place for gazing at the moon and stars. That long thing sticking out of the dome is a telescope – the biggest one in all Miracula," replied Felicity. Pp 89-90

- Students discuss the function of a telescope. What does it do? What can we see? Have you ever looked through a telescope before?
- Look at some pictures together of space, stars, planets in our solar system.
- Students learn about the planets in our solar system- nice video explaining each planet in the following link: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=STaWWfv67XM

Planetarium Visit

- Students could go on a class trip to their local 'observatory' or planetarium.
- Or students research their local planetarium and create a visitor leaflet.

Time Puns

How many different ways can the word tick be used? tick (insect), clock ticking, tick someone off, tick a list etc. Students discuss as a class.

Clock, and hands:

lend someone a hand, a pair of hands, many hands make light work.

Students could research these and create a display board of bubble writing for the classroom.

Time

- Students scan the book for clocks and see if they can read the time on each.
- Raffle- how many clocks are featured in the book? Students guess and the closest gets a prize. (There are 56).
